

Lotte Gernsheimer, née. Mainzer, and her husband Sol (Sally) Gernsheimer

Lotte Gernsheimer née Mainzer, was a nursery nurse. In 1933 she travelled from Heppenheim to Strasbourg, France and reached New York, USA in 1937.

She married Sol Gernsheimer, who had emigrated together with his mother from Viernheim to the USA in 1939. Lotte died on 21.03.1995 and was buried next to her husband in the cemetery Cedar Park in Paramus, New Jersey, USA.

Rudolf Mainzer left Heppenheim in 1933 and studied Law and Economics in France, Belgium and Holland. He emigrated to Sao Paolo, Brazil.



When his mother Johanna moved in with Georg and Lore in Paraguay, Rudolf joined them.

At the beginning of the 1950s, he married the ballet dancer Dorothea Jankilovici. In 1952 Claudia Patricia was born and in 1956 Virginia Carolina. Rudolf died on 10th September 1971 and was buried in the Jewish cemetery Tablada in Buenos Aires.

In the art project Stolpersteine by Gunter Demnig the families of victims and survivers of the Nazi regime are brought together.

Hence also the surviving family members, such as the three children of Johanna and Berthold Mainzer, are included and receive a stone.

Berthold Mainzer (*1877) ran his father's business after 1906 with his brother Jakob. In 1910 he married Johanna Mayer (*1887) and they had three children: Georg (*1911) and the twins Lotte and Rudolf (*1913).





Johanna Mainzer with her children Rudolf, Lotte and Georg. After a short internment in the Osthofen concentration camp in 1933, Berthold was sent to the concentration camp at Buchenwald in November 1938. The same year there were plans to emigrate via an inventory of land in Paraguay.

In 1940 he and his wife were taken into "protective custody". **Berthold died on 13th July 1940.**

"in 1940 he was again arrested and sent to prison in Darmstadt, where he then died. I had always admired how quickly he ran up stairs despite him being, at least in my eyes, an elderly man. He was physically top fit. When I heard that he had died in prison I knew he had been killed. (Quote: Peter Metzendorf)

Johanna was interned in old people's home for a while. In 1940 she was able to flee via Japan to Argentina and then on to Paraguay to her son Georg.



Johanna died on 22nd June 1977 in Buenos Aires und was buried in the Jewish cemetery Tablada.

Georg Mainzer, active member of the Social Democratic Party, was humiliated and persecuted on the day of the March election (5th March 1933)

because of his public opposition to National Socialism:

SA Men force him to wash off the three arrows

symbol of social democratic organizations.

In 1935 he fled to Paraguay and married Lore Kahn in 1936. Their daughter Eva was born in 1937. Later the fam-



ily moved to Buenos Aires, Argentina.

Georg (Jorge) died on 25th May 1968 and was buried in the Jeweish cemetery Tablada in Buenos Aires.
